LAKE ERIE'S UNSOLVED MYSTERY: MARQUETTE & BESSEMER No. 2

The Marquette & Bessemer No. 2 has been the "holy grail" for Lake Erie shipwreck hunters since it was lost in the great storm of December 1909. This 350-foot steel car ferry left Conneaut, Ohio for Port Stanley, Ontario loaded with rail cars of coal and one passenger, who was rumored to have \$50,000 in cash in his brief case.

COLLISION OF THE MORNING STAR AND CORTLAND

In June of 1868 the side wheel steamer Morning Star and the bark Cortland came together in the middle of Lake Erie with tragic results. The investigation into the loss of both vessels led to the navigational lighting used today.



THE DYNAMIC DOZEN

Discover one dozen recently found shipwrecks from a schooner sporting a large brass bell to a long sought after steamer.

COMMODORE & JAY GOULD

On June 17, 1918, the last battle of the two Robber Barons who built these vessels came to an end as the barge Commodore and steamer Jay Gould went to the bottom. The Gould has been a popular dive site for years. But, the Commodore lav lost until her discovery in 2011 by the Wachters.

SHIPWRECKS OF LAKE ERIE — FIRE, STORM, COLLISION

Lake Erie has perhaps the largest concentration of shipwrecks per square mile of any body of water in the world. From the 1700's to the present a variety of military and commercial vessels have been lost on her waters. The talk explores wreck types with their stories in chronological order.

Sidewheel Treasure and Tragedy

On the open waters of the Great Lakes, sidewheel steamer mishaps account for 6 of the 10 worst loss of life disasters. These accidents escalated in severity, from the beaching of the Walk-in-the-

Water in Lake Erie, to the sinking of the Lady Elgin on Lake Michigan. Many of these were true treasure ships, since they carried gold and the personal possessions of



hundreds of immigrants. Highlights of disaster causes, paddle wheel engines, and comparisons of the wrecks on the bottom to current museum sidewheelers completes this talk.

On February 17, 1944 the tropical skies over Truk Lagoon exploded with rage as U.S. Navy Task Force 58 - made up of 7 battle ships, 9 aircraft carriers and a host of cruisers, destroyers and subs, launched an attack on Truk Lagoon. Mike and Georgann will take you back in history to explore the shipwrecks of Chuuk and the events leading to their loss.

THE BIG THREE: LUCITANIA, EASTLAND, EDMOND FITZGERALD

Perhaps the three greatest shipwreck disasters of the last century. Do these three ships have a secret in common? Georgann and Mike will tell you there stories and explore the secrets of these tragic shipwreck disasters.

BLACK FRIDAY — LAKE ERIE'S "PERFECT STORM"

The name "Black Friday" was given to the date of October 20, 1916, after a violent storm sank ships and ended lives on Lake Erie. The whaleback *James B. Colgate*, the lumber hooker *Marshal Butters*, the steamer *Merida*, and the barge *D.L. Filer* were all lost in a convergence of storms that created Lake Eire's "Perfect Storm". The captains were the sole survivors on two of these vessels.
